ABOUT THE COVER

The 47th Problem of Euclid

Euclid, also known as Euclid of Alexandria, "The Father of Geometry" was a Greek mathematician of the Hellenistic period who flourished in Alexandria, Egypt.

By what mode can a mason ensure the correctness of the Square? How can he ensure that the angle between the two limbs of the Square shall be truly a right or square angle?

There are many ways known to modern science whereby this can be done, but the most ancient, and perhaps the simplest, is by means of the 47th Proposition of the first book of Euclid.

This Proposition is known certainly for twenty-four centuries, and probably much longer, and by it we can prove that in a triangle, one of the angles of which is a right angle, the square of the side opposite the right angle is equal to both the squares on the sides containing the right angle: it follows then that if we make any triangle in which the square of one side is equal to both the squares of the two other sides, then the angle opposite that side must be a true right angle,—the angle of a correct square.

Euclid wrote a set of thirteen books, which were called Elements. Each book contained many geometric propositions and explanations, and in total Euclid published 465 problems. The 47th problem was set out in Book 1, which is also known as The Pythagorean Theorem. Why is it called by both these names? Although Euclid published the proposition, it was Pythagoras who discovered it.

Greetings Ladies!

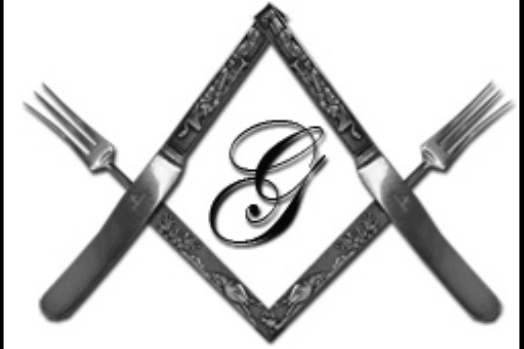
This month the brethren are concentrating on getting ready for advance stations, so we will not be doing any events this month.
