## WHY “ENTERED” APPRENTICES

Early references to Mason Apprentices are rare but this may well be because our knowledge of Craft organization is largely based on building accounts, these usually relate to important buildings such as abbeys or castles, at the erection of which apprentices would scarcely be encouraged.

The Entered Apprentice was a feature of Scottish operative masonry at least as early as 1598 though the term is not heard of in English Masonry before the first Book of Constitutions, written in 1723 by a Scotsman.

According to the Scottish practice an apprentice, after completing his seven years under indenture was “entered” in the Lodge and became an Entered Apprentice. He was then allowed to do a certain amount of work on his own account but was not yet free to undertake a building enterprise involving the employment of subordinate labour.
