Robert was entered as an apprentice mason at Lodge St. David in Tarbolton on 4th July 1781. He became a Master Mason four months later. He was a dedicated mason over the next ten years or so, warmly embracing the masonic ideals of brotherhood, liberty and equality. He eventually became the depute master of his lodge.
